Conservation Achievement Awards

Program Mission

The intent of the KWFF Conservation Achievement Awards Program is to further the proper utilization, conservation and management of the natural resources in the State of Kentucky — including our air, soils, waters, minerals, forests, fisheries and wildlife. The awards program is designed to bring about greater knowledge of conservation projects and efforts by giving proper recognition to those persons and organizations who have made outstanding personal, educational and informational contributions to the natural resource welfare within the State of Kentucky.

Submission Requirements

Below are the current award categories established by the KWFF Board of Directors. Any individual or organization, who is a member in good standing with the League of Kentucky Sportsmen organization, may make a nomination for any of these award categories. An individual or organization may be nominated for multiple categories so long as they meet the minimum specified requirements for each listed category. However, a single Nomination Form must be completed under each category for which an individual or organization is being nominated.

In order to nominate an individual or organization for an awards category, the individual or organization making that nomination must fully and timely complete and submit the attached KWFF Conservation Achievement Awards Nomination Form to the KWFF's Secretary's mailing and/or email address provided on that Form.

All completed nomination forms must be postmarked, or received with date stamp if by email, by no later

than April 30th.

AWARD CATEGORIES

Conservationist of the Year

Any individual, but preferably an active sportsman or woman, who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their efforts, supported, defended, assisted or has otherwise made an extraordinary contribution to the growth, maintenance or preservation of Kentucky's fish, wildlife or outdoor resources.

Wildlife Conservationist of the Year

Any individual, but preferably an active sportsman or woman, who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their efforts, supported, defended, assisted or has otherwise made an extraordinary contribution to the growth, maintenance or preservation of Kentucky's wildlife or wildlife environment.

Forest Conservationist of the Year

Any individual, but preferably an active sportsman or woman, who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their efforts, supported, defended, assisted or has otherwise made an extraordinary contribution to the growth, maintenance or preservation of Kentucky's forestry lands or forestry-related programs.

Soil Conservationist of the Year

Any individual, but preferably an active sportsman or woman, who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their efforts, supported, defended, assisted or has otherwise made an extraordinary contribution to the growth,

maintenance or preservation of Kentucky's soils and/or lands.

Water Conservationist of the Year

Any individual, but preferably an active sportsman or woman, who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their efforts, supported, defended, assisted or has otherwise made an extraordinary contribution to the growth, maintenance or preservation of Kentucky's water resources, including rivers, lakes, streams, ponds or tributaries.

High School Student Conservationist of the Year

Any individual currently enrolled in any accredited high school in the Commonwealth of Kentucky at the time of application who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their efforts, supported, defended, assisted or has otherwise made an extraordinary contribution to the growth, maintenance or preservation of Kentucky's fish, wildlife or outdoor resources.

College Student Conservationist of the Year

Any individual currently enrolled in any accredited college or university in the Commonwealth of Kentucky at the time of application who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their efforts, supported, defended, assisted or has otherwise made an extraordinary contribution to the growth, maintenance or preservation of Kentucky's fish, wildlife or outdoor resources.

Conservation Educator of the Year

Any individual or organization, but preferably an active sportsman or woman, or like group, who through some combination of prolonged activism and/or contributions beyond a Conservationist's normal participation has, through their educational efforts, has

Describe specific acts for which the recommendation is based.
How long has the participant been engaged in this activity?
Describe what has been done to enhance the wildlife environment.
In what ways has sound conservation practices been promoted?
What are some of the results of your project?
Has the project had or been used for any educational purposes?
Give names of any awards received.
Give names of organization memberships or affiliations.
List any past achievements.
List any past recognitions.
Any additional information supporting the nominee's contributions to conservation.
